

Jalen Hurts and DeVonta Smith Steal Nashville's Final Moment

Read the story, then answer the questions.

How the Game Began

On Sunday, September 20, 2026, the Philadelphia Eagles, the away team, beat the Tennessee Titans, the home team, 24-20 in Nashville. Philadelphia arrived at 1-0, while Tennessee hoped Cam Ward could guide its young roster after an opening loss. The Titans struck first when Hooker intercepted Hurts at the goal line and returned the ball 92 yards. Ward then sneaked in from 1 yard out. Philadelphia answered early in the second quarter as Tank Bigsby scored from 2 yards, tying the game 7-7.

The Deciding Moments

Hurts then developed a rhythm with Smith, who made 18- and 22-yard catches before scoring on a 22-yard touchdown reception. Ward responded by moving Tennessee into field-goal range, and Joey Slye cut Philadelphia's halftime lead to 14-10. Jake Elliott's 58-yard field goal gave the Eagles more room in the third quarter, but Ward's second 1-yard rushing touchdown tied it 17-17. Later, Harris intercepted Hurts, and Tennessee turned a long Ayomanor catch and Spears run into Slye's 33-yard field goal. Down 20-17 with 1:56 left, Hurts drove Philadelphia to the 3-yard line before hitting Cooper for the winning score with nine seconds remaining.

Big Performances and Takeaways

Smith led Philadelphia with 10 catches, 117 yards, and a touchdown, giving Hurts a dependable target when the final drive mattered most. Hurts passed for 264 yards and two touchdowns, while Wicks added 74 receiving yards. Ward offered Tennessee real encouragement, passing for 183 yards and running for both scores without an interception. Pollard added 64 rushing yards as the Titans

totaled 122 on the ground. The Eagles are now 2-0 and will face the Chicago Bears, knowing they can recover from errors. Tennessee falls to 0-2 but showed it can compete before meeting the New York Giants.

- 1 **C** Hooker intercepted Hurts at the goal line and returned the ball 92 yards.

Hooker's long interception return set up Ward's 1-yard touchdown, which gave Tennessee the first score of the game.

- 2 **A** Tennessee scored before Philadelphia scored.

The phrase refers to Tennessee scoring first, after the interception return and Ward's 1-yard rushing touchdown.

- 3 **A** Hurts drove to the 3-yard line and threw a touchdown with nine seconds left.

With Philadelphia trailing 20-17 late in the game, Hurts led a drive to Tennessee's 3-yard line and threw the winning touchdown with nine seconds remaining.

- 4 **D** Both teams responded to key plays, but Philadelphia made the final decisive play.

The section shows repeated responses by both teams: Tennessee answered Philadelphia's scores and took a late lead, but Philadelphia's final touchdown decided the game.

- 5 **D** Smith had 10 catches for 117 yards and a touchdown.

Smith's team-leading 10 catches, 117 yards, and touchdown show that he consistently produced for Philadelphia.

- 6 What a good answer includes:

A strong response explains that Philadelphia can be confident because it is 2-0 and has productive players such as Smith and Hurts. It also explains that Tennessee has encouragement despite falling to 0-2 because Ward accounted for two rushing touchdowns without an interception and the team rushed for 122 yards.
