STORY

Read the story, then answer the questions.

How the Game Went

Detroit led 7-0 at halftime after Jahmyr Gibbs scored from 1 yard out. In the third quarter, Derrick Barnes intercepted Tyler Shough, and Gibbs scored again. After another Saints mistake, Jared Goff hit Amon-Ra St. Brown for a 19-yard touchdown and a 21-0 lead. New Orleans fought back with scores by Kendre Miller, Devaughn Vele, and Juwan Johnson. After Detroit led 24-17, Johnson tied it with 1:07 left. In overtime, Goff found St. Brown for a 4-yard touchdown and a 31-30 win.

Standout Performers

Gibbs powered Detroit's offense with 156 rushing yards and two touchdowns. He broke runs of 21 and 11 yards on the Lions' first scoring drive. St. Brown caught 10 passes for 67 yards and two touchdowns, including the overtime winner. Goff helped Detroit spread the ball around, while Jameson Williams made a 22-yard catch to the 5 in overtime. For New Orleans, Shough threw for 410 yards and three touchdowns. Chris Olave made 10 catches for 182 yards during the Saints' comeback.

What It Means

The Lions are 1-0 after opening the season with a close win, and they next face the Buffalo Bills. Detroit showed it can finish important drives when the pressure is highest. In overtime, Gibbs ran hard, Williams made a key catch, and Goff connected with St. Brown. New Orleans is 0-1 and will play the Baltimore Ravens next. Still, the Saints showed perseverance by climbing back from a 21-0 deficit. Shough and his young receivers proved they can challenge teams all season.

WORDS TO KNOW

From the story.

intercepted (v.): Caught a pass thrown by the other team, causing a turnover.

overtime (n.): Extra playing time used when a game is tied after regulation.

rushing (adj.): Moving the ball by running with it instead of throwing a pass.

comeback (n.): A strong effort by a team that was losing to get back into a game.

pressure (n.): The stress or challenge of performing well in an important moment.

- 1 **D** Juwan Johnson tied the game with 1:07 left.

The text says Detroit led 24-17 before Juwan Johnson tied the score with 1:07 remaining. That tie required the teams to play overtime.

- 2 **D** Detroit built a lead, but New Orleans rallied before Detroit won in overtime.

The section describes Detroit taking a 21-0 lead, New Orleans tying the game late, and Detroit winning on an overtime touchdown. These events develop the idea of a close game with major momentum changes.

- 3 **C** Gibbs gained more total yards, while St. Brown caught more passes.

Gibbs had 156 rushing yards and two touchdowns, while St. Brown had 10 catches for 67 yards and two touchdowns. Therefore, Gibbs gained more yards and St. Brown made more catches.

- 4 **C** Goff involved different teammates in the passing offense.

The phrase means Goff used several receivers, as shown by the mentions of St. Brown and Williams making important catches. It does not mean that every pass was long or that he avoided key players.

- 5 **D** Detroit could make important plays when pressure was highest.

The section directly states that Detroit showed it can finish important drives under pressure. It supports this with Gibbs's running, Williams's key catch, and Goff's connection with St. Brown.

- 6 What a good answer includes:

A strong answer explains that Detroit showed it can perform under pressure, while New Orleans showed perseverance and potential despite losing. It should use details such as Detroit's overtime plays by Gibbs, Williams, Goff, and St. Brown, and New Orleans climbing back from a 21-0 deficit with Shough and young receivers.
