STORY

Read the story, then answer the questions.

A Fast Start

Washington needed one huge play to change its season. The Commanders had lost their first two games. Seattle arrived at Northwest Stadium with two wins and plenty of speed.

Washington struck first after Seattle lost the ball near its own goal line. Marcus Mariota then threw a short touchdown pass to Rachaad White. A touchdown gives a team six points. Seattle soon tied the game when Sam Darnold found Jaxon Smith-Njigba in the end zone.

A Tight Battle

Washington answered with a long drive down the field. Treyton Burks caught an 11-yard touchdown pass for a 14-7 lead. Before halftime, Drew Stevens made a 57-yard field goal. Washington led 17-10 at the break.

After halftime, Sonny Styles caught a Darnold pass meant for Seattle. That steal gave Washington the ball at Seattle's 42-yard line. Mariota quickly threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Terry McLaurin. But Seattle fought back. Smith-Njigba made a clever trick-play pass, then caught a touchdown himself. The game was tied 24-24.

Medrano's Giant Run

Stevens made another field goal, putting Washington ahead 27-24. Then came the biggest play. With less than four minutes left, linebacker Kain Medrano caught another Darnold pass. He raced 50 yards for a touchdown.

That kind of score is called a pick-six. A player picks off, or catches, a pass and runs it in. Washington led 33-24 after the extra kick missed. Seattle scored once more, making it 33-31. Yet White ran 19 yards, and Mariota ran late to help use up the clock. Washington held on for its first win, 33-31.

What a good answer includes:

A strong answer explains that Washington scored early, built leads with touchdowns and field goals, and stayed in a close game when Seattle tied it. It should describe Medrano's 50-yard pick-six as a key late play and explain that White and Mariota ran to use up the clock after Seattle scored again.
